A Global Vision for Restoration, Earthcare & Transformation



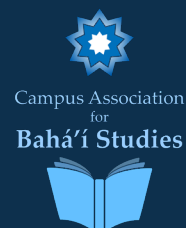

Harold Rosen examines justice not only as a legal or political concept, but as a moral, spiritual, and social force connected to peace, unity, human rights, reconciliation, and the flourishing of humanity. Drawing on perspectives from Africa, the Americas, Asia, the Middle East, Europe, and the Baha'i writings, this program invites participants to consider how Justice can be understood as restorative, transformative, and essential to building a more compassionate and interdependent world.
